Re: Request for information (our ref: NFRS2020-225-255)

I am writing in response to your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, received 29 August 2020. Our response is provided below:

Following on an anonymous claim made via Twitter from someone who describes themselves as a firefighter.

Their main claims are that new procedures concerning on-site emergency treatment of injured people contain:

- 1) Abolishing the use of bag valve masks, now only allowing chest compression
- 2) Reducing oxygen use from 100% to 50%
- 3) Replacing the use of shaking the casualty to establish vital signs with kicking them instead

My information request is as follows:

Q1 Is claim one above true?

Since the COVID-19 outbreak, Northamptonshire Fire and Rescue Service (NFRS) have ceased using bag valve masks both in training and operationally. This is following guidance from the British Heart Foundation and our emergency service partners East Midlands Ambulance Service (EMAS). Our clinical governance arrangements are with EMAS.

Q2 Is claim two above true?

The oxygen flow-rate has not changed. This is still delivered at 15 litres per minute and is 100% oxygen.

Q3 Is claim three above true?

When checking for vital signs as part of the patient assessment, there are numerous ways of looking for a response depending on the patient condition and associated mechanisms of injury.

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The common techniques include gentle shaking of the casualty's shoulders or applying slight pressure to the collar bone. The second technique is more apt when there is suspected spinal damage. Kicking a patient is not a technique adopted by NFRS or EMAS.
