## Description of current provision/policy and main beneficiaries/stakeholders

Northamptonshire Fire and Rescue Service has a duty to safeguard "adults at risk" and the current policy is dated January 2019 and needed to be refreshed and reviewed to reflect changes in processes and procedures, new legislation and the change to a two unitary authority, which took place on 1st April 2021.

## Description of proposal under consideration/development

The revised policy C5 reflects the changes that Northamptonshire County Council has recently undertaken, moving from a County Council and seven District and Bouorgh Councils to a new two unitary authority consisting of North Northamptonshire Council and West Northamptonshire Council. This resulted in changes to contacts, telephone numbers, reporting process and procedures.

Safeguarding is also now far more person centered, ensuring that the persons voice is heard and consent to safeguard a person and work with them is more important, which the policy has been updated to reflect. New links to guidance and toolkits has been included. We also have a new role in place for safeguarding work, and the policy has been updated to include the new Complex Case Officer role.

The revised policy will now ensure that we respond to safeguarding concerns as quickly and effectively as possible in order to achieve the best outcomes for the "adults at risk" that we encounter. This may be through the course of operational incidents or the delivery of Prevention and Protection activities, or from the trusted partners that we work with.
