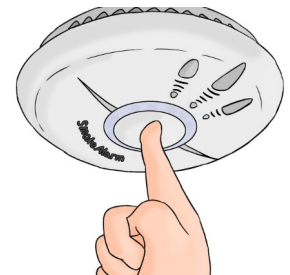

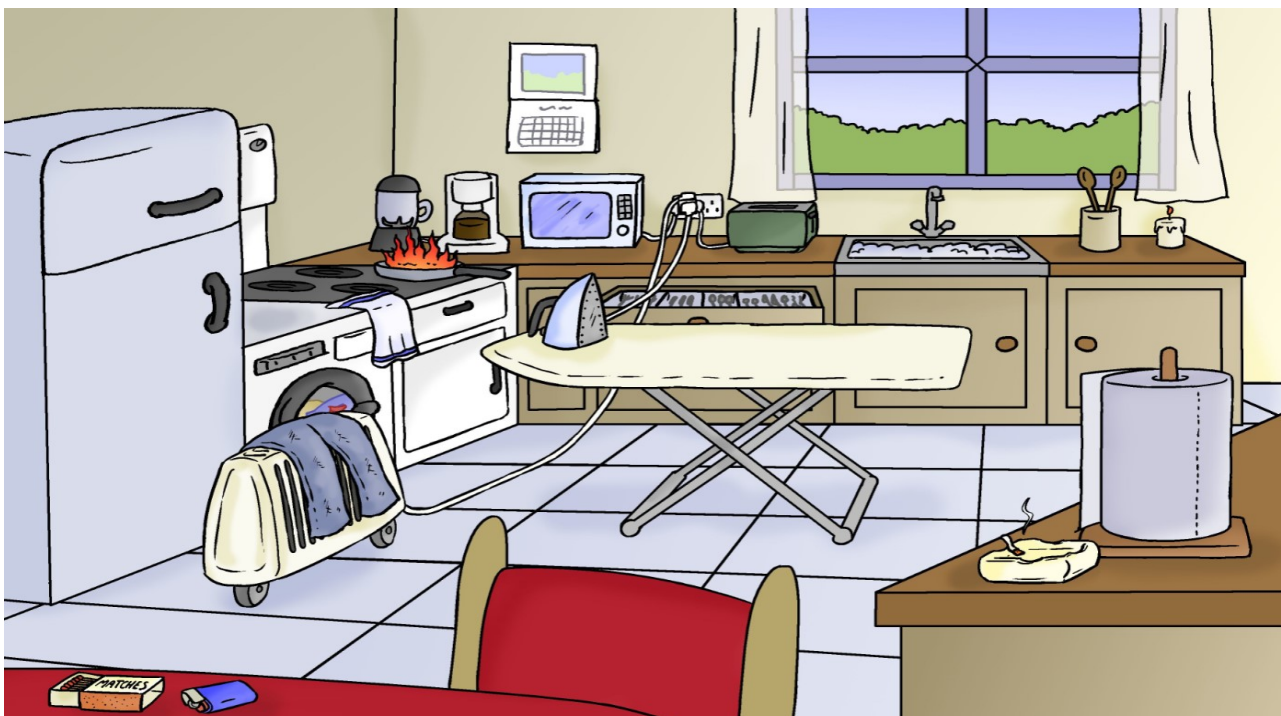

Below is a list of different activities that can either be a way to keep you safe or a way a fire could be started.

Sort them into the correct boxes below!

- Testing your fire alarms once a week (Test it Tuesday!)
- Overloading plug sockets
- Burning candles and leaving the room
- Leaving fairy lights on over-night
- Keeping doorways and hallways clear
- Remind grown ups to turn off all plugs not being used before bed
- Knowing all the ways out of the home
- Having a smoke alarm on every floor of the house
- Remind grown ups to put out cigarettes or candles properly
- Shut all doors at night before going to bed

# Safety in the home



Follow this advice to keep safe.

Match the object to the advice that you should follow when using or near this object.

Candle	Never put metal in it
Microwave	Don't touch! Make sure a grown up puts them in a safe place
Matches/lighter	Make sure blankets or clothing don't cover it
Fireplace	Keep on a hard surface when charging and away from bedding. Never leave this under your pillow
Hairdryer	Don't hold the mug as you pour the water and always make sure there is water in before you switch it on
Phones/devices	Don't stand too close in case your clothes catch fire
Oven	Always blow it out before you leave the room
Kettle	Never stick a fork or knife in if your food is stuck
Toaster	Remember to unplug this even when it isn't in use. Just because there is no device attached doesn't mean it's safe to leave it
Lamp	Don't use it near a sink or the bath. Always make sure you switch it off before you leave the room
Chargers	Don't interrupt your parents or carers when they are cooking as they need to concentrate on what they are doing

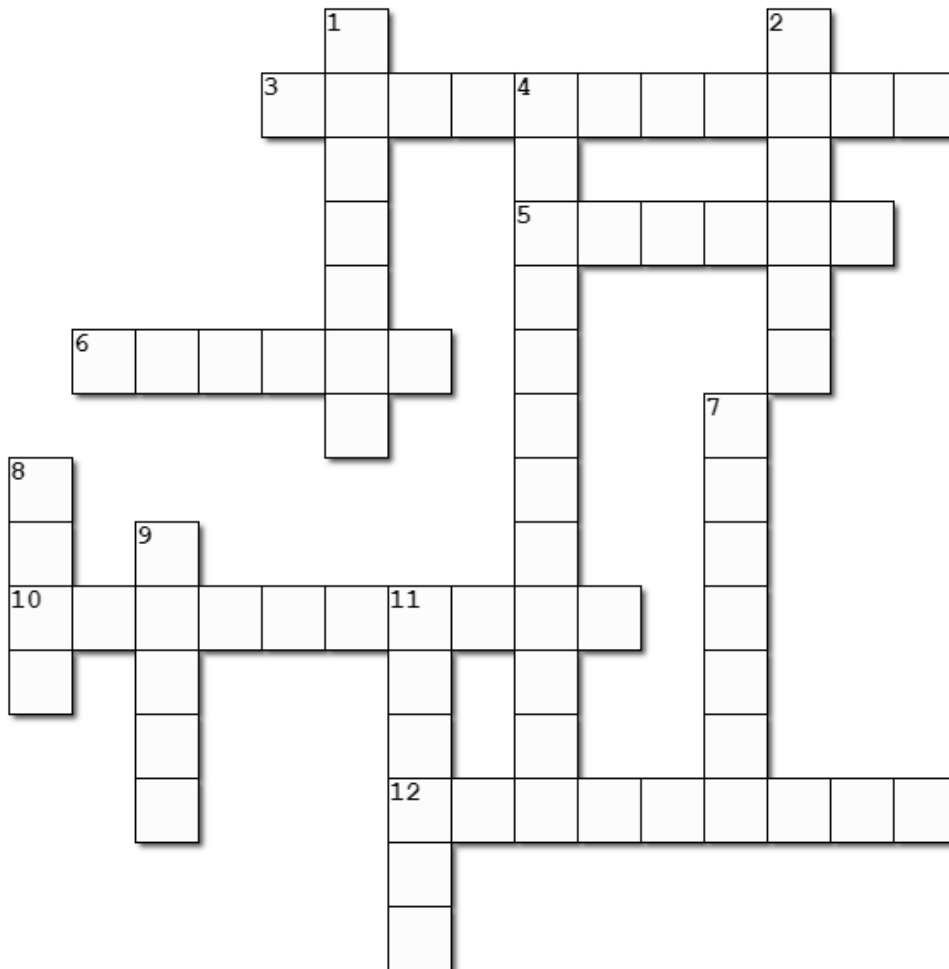

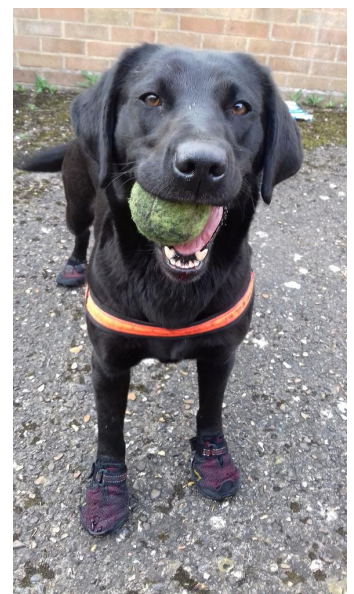

# What to do if there's a fire

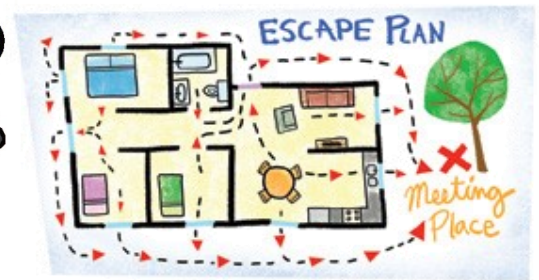
You need to know how to get out of your house if there's a fire.

When you're finished, add in TWO colourful arrows to show the escape routes you could use.

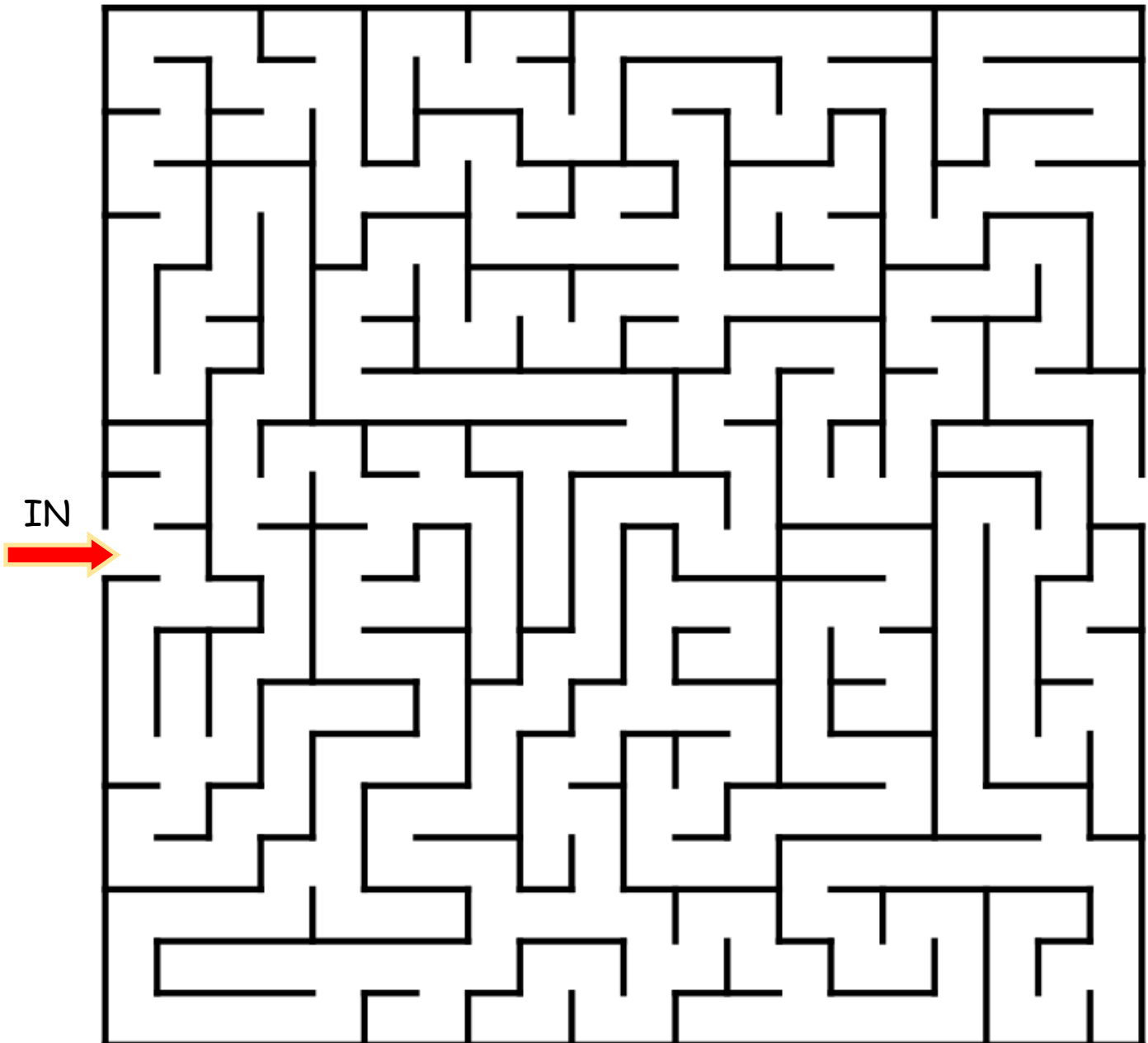

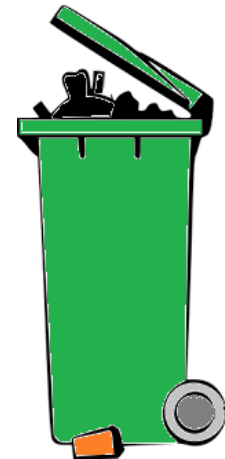

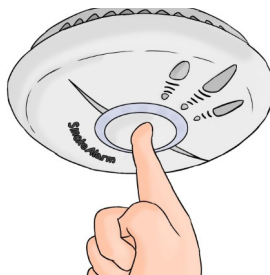
